ERRATUM

EDUCATION AND TRAINING GUIDELINES FOR ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN MIDWIFERY (NQF Level 7)

TO ALL NURSING EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS:

1. Section 10.5 of the above-mentioned guidelines was erroneously written as follows:

A minimum of **80%** of formative assessment must be done in 'real life' situations to enable remedial and developmental action and activities prior to the final summative assessment.

Section 10.5 should read as follows:

A minimum of **60%** of formative assessment must be done in 'real life' situations to enable remedial and developmental action and activities prior to the final summative assessment.

2. Section 11.1.10 of the above-mentioned guidelines was erroneously written as follows:

Clinical education and training shall include placement during the night (night shifts) which shall not exceed **one (01)** month of an academic year.

Section 11.1.10 should read as follows:

Clinical education and training shall include placement during the night (night shifts) which shall not exceed **two (02)** months of an academic year.

3. Section 12 on Table 3: ELO 2 of the advanced Diploma in Midwifery.

3.1. The concepts "antenatal and post-natal" should be changed to "anteartum and postpartum" respectively.

3.2. Added "management of high risk pregnancy" under anteartum phase.

3.3. Added "Management of high-risk neonate" under postpartum phase.

3.4. The percentages allocated for the phases in Table 3 under Exit Level Outcome (ELO) 2 were changed to reflect as follows:

Phases	Percentages
Pre-conception	5%
Antepartum	25%
Intrapartum	45%
Postpartum	20%

4. Added 5% for ELO 3, 4 and 5 under Table 3.

NB. The above allocated percentages serves as minimum requirements. Nursing Education Institutions can change the weighting as long as they do not go below the specified percentages.
